- 2. Acting as a Commission of Presbytery, appointed Heather Thiessen to serve as Moderator of Session for United Presbyterian Church, Laconia, effective May 1, 2022

The Presbytery Council met Mat 31, 2022, by videoconference and took the following actions:

- 1. Acting as a Commission of Presbytery, elected Alan Finnan to fill John Napoli's unexpired term on Committee on Ministry, and further elected him to serve as Co-Moderator of the Committee on Ministry, effective June 15, 2022.

- 3. Acting as a Commission of Presbytery appointed of Kelley Jepson as Moderator of Session for United Presbyterian Church, Bloomington.

1. That the following dates be set for 2023 Assemblies:

- a. Saturday, February 25
- b. Thursday, May 25
- c. Saturday, August 19
- d. Thursday, November 16

It was m/s/c to APPROVE the dates for the 2023 Presbytery Assemblies.

2. That the Presbytery of Ohio Valley set the 2023 per capita at \$50.15

<u>Background</u>: Presbyterians have a form of government built upon shared authority and mutual accountability as we seek together to find and represent the mind of Christ. Per Capita dollars provide the primary means for elected members to gather at Presbytery assemblies, Synod assemblies, and the biennial General Assembly. In addition, Per Capita funds the constitutionally required functions of each body.

The Presbytery Council recommends that the 2023 Per Capita Giving be set at \$50.15. Of that total amount, \$3.81 goes to the Synod of Lincoln Trails, \$9.85 goes to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and \$36.49 is retained by the Presbytery.

Besides providing for the means for us to gather to discern the mind of Christ, Per Capita in the Presbytery of Ohio Valley supports: 100% of the compensation for the Treasurer and Stated Clerk, 75% of the compensation for the two Administrative Associates, 50% of the compensation for the Executive Presbyter, 25% of administrative and office

expenses, and 100% of ecclesiastical expenses (including expenses for assemblies, administrative commissions, and entities such as the Trustees, Committee on Ministry, Committee on Preparation for Ministry that perform constitutionally required work).

While the \$50.15 recommended Per Capita amount does not fund all the constitutionally required functions of the Presbytery, the Presbytery Council believes the recommended amount is an important step towards fully funding the constitutionally required functions of the Presbytery.

The 225th General Assembly took actions that it hopes will provide new funding models for the church that are more sustainable moving forward, and the Council shares in this hope.

The Council welcomes conversation from pastors and sessions about funding ministry and mission.

It was m/s/c to APPROVE the 2023 Presbytery per capita at \$50.15.

It was m/s/c to APPROVE granting the Rev. Dr. Martha FrizLanger the status of Honorably Retired, effective August 31, 2022.

Mary asked the moderator to recognize the Rev. Larry Langer to bring a letter and a gift from Martha. Much appreciation was given for the gift of the stained-glass window of the Presbyterian Seal.

The letter was read to the Assembly, and it was m/s/c to APPROVE entering it into the Minutes of Presbytery. (See Appendix B.)

2) That the Presbytery of Ohio Valley set the following standards for 2023 minimum compensation for pastors and commissioned pastors (representing an increase of 7.0%).

Rationale: The Committee on Ministry (COM) for the Presbytery of Ohio Valley met on July 12 and voted to recommend a 7.0% increase in compensation for 2023. The increase for 2022 was 2.0%. The minimum compensation recommendations for the past few years have been based on changes in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all urban consumers, a widely used measure of inflation produced by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. More recently we have also consulted the Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE) Price Index produced by the Bureau of Economic Analysis part of the Department of Commerce and used by the Federal Reserve as the measure of inflation to inform monetary policy for the US.

Last year both indices indicated a 2.0% increase was appropriate. This year for the 12 months ending June 30 the CPI average was 7.16% and the average increase in the PCE index was 5.63%. For the first six months of the years the CPI has averaged 8.3% and the PCE has averaged 6.4%. We prayerfully considered what would be a fair increase for both congregations and pastors in 2023 and believe a 7.0% increase is warranted considering the data available to us.

It was m/s/c to APPROVE the Presbytery Minimum Compensation for ministers and commissioned pastors as recommended – a 7% increase over 2022.

Employing organizations will pay regularly in advance to the board responsible for benefits a sum equal to that requisite percent of effective salary (salary + housing or 30+% of salary, utilities, and any deferred compensation) which may be fixed by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) including pension, medical coverage, and death and disability benefits. **The total BOP totals 39% for a full-time pastor (\$20,874) or Commissioned Pastor (\$15,660).** [Note: for part-time pastors of 20 hrs or more, BOP contributions will vary between 31.5% and 50%.] For pastors working over 20 hours per week, who are not members of the Board of Pensions, a comparable amount will be paid to their denomination's plan or other mutually-agreed-upon retirement program.
