Mileage Rate Update!

Note to churches that reimburse pastors and other church workers for mileage: there is a small decrease in the IRS allowed reimbursable rate. In 2009 the rate will be 55¢ per mile. It has been 58.5¢ per mile for the last half of 2008.

Presbytery of Ohio Valley recommends reimbursing guest preachers, pastors and other church workers at the IRS rate.

Presbytery of Ohio Valley Helps Bring Hope to Flood Victims

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. — Drawing on a \$50,000 grant from the Presbytery of Ohio Valley, a newly formed ecumenical ministry in Terre Haute, Ind. is bringing hope to families in five Indiana counties still reeling from the June flooding.

Terre Haute Ministries, Inc. was formed before the flood to bring the Terre Haute faith community together in common mission. The flood presented a clear need for mission, and the group has joined with other community leaders in restoring people to their homes. Terre Haute Ministries has taken on the role of providing volunteer coordination, construction, and in-kind donations management for the five-

county Wabash Valley Long Term
Disaster Recovery Coalition. The
Presbytery of Ohio Valley's grant funds a
full-time executive director who is
already fully engaged in recovery efforts.

A recently completed door-to-door survey showed that the number of flood survivors who still need assistance may be nearly 10 times greater than first believed. The Christian Reformed World Relief Committee (CRWRC), a group specializing in damage and needs assessments, thought they would find about 40 households in need of assistance. Instead, their neighborhood canvases turned up 250 households, and they expect that number to reach as high as 400 before the count is finished.

Unmet needs remaining after FEMA and other assistance average \$9,200 per household, according to the Rev.
Honnalora Hubbard, executive director of Terre Haute Ministries. "CRWRC was overwhelmed by the level of need in this area," she said. "CRWRC also said the need would probably be much higher except that the area had already benefited by neighbors, friends and families who helped each other," she added.

Overall financial needs for the recovery effort may reach \$8 million once the cost of tools, safety equipment and other supplies are added to the cost of repair materials.

The soon-to-open 111th Congress will include at least four new Presbyterian members: Mark Warner of Virginia and Kay Hagen of North Carolina (both Republicans) in the Senate; and Jim Hines of Connecticut and Glenn Nye of Virginia (both Democrats) in the House.



Rana Khoury's Visit

Rana Khoury's time in the Presbytery of Ohio Valley was a gift. She tells the story of the work of the International Center of Bethlehem in clear and helpful ways. The question time is her favorite time and she answers questions in ways that lift up the work we can all be engaged with here and now, near and far. I am grateful that the Presbytery Partnership includes this travel possibility and that the Presbytery Peacemaking funds are put to this use.

I want to share with you all some of the known outcomes of her travel here. The work continues to unfold in surprising and wondrous ways.

1. Rana addressed groups in Jeffersonville, Hanover, Corydon, Evansville and Columbus, with a combined audience of 150 plus. She was also introduced in a Sunday worship.

- 2. We bought olive leaf jewelry, made by the Bethlehem women and sold at the gift shop of the Center. We sent \$1193.00 with Rana, to the gift shop.
- 3. We offered Mitri's books as gifts to the host congregations and for sale to others.
- 4. The Corydon Congregation presented Rana with a gift of \$573.03, for the work in Bethlehem.
- 5. We prepared holiday cards saying "A gift has been given in your honor to the Bright Stars of Bethlehem." \$400.00 was given in this way.
- 6. A trip to Bethlehem is planned for Nov 2-11, 2009. The information was available/shared and two people have sent their money to go.

In addition.....

We discovered that 6 members of the Jeffersonville congregation are going to the

area in January 2009. One of them is a physician very interested in the hearing aid project and he is now in touch with the Health and Wellness Center in Bethlehem. it will be fun to watch that ministry grow, ministering to the 4000+ people who are served at the audiology clinic each year. I hope some of us will meet with the Jeffersonville folks in February. What an grand enrichment of the partnership with their insights!

One of the women who heard Rana hopes to get the electronic pen-pal part of the partnership enlivened.

Four people want to offer gifts from the shop at the International Center of Bethlehem at their congregations' alternative holiday giving opportunities.

Two people want to host a fund raiser for the International Center.

One person is interested in working with legislators.

Fax/Printer/Scanner/Copier Available




Items needed for the God's Grace Store
