Volunteers Needed for Rebuilding Aftermath of the 2008 Flooding

Consider volunteering to help the long-term recovery needs following the June 2008 flooding in the northern part of the presbytery.

Yes, there is still great need for volunteers to help in recovery efforts following the largest disaster in Indiana history. In Bartholomew County alone, 2500 families were affected. Much of the clean-up work has been completed, now there is need for both skilled and unskilled labor, especially in the spring when rebuilds will be happening. You or your group can offer what works for you and the sight you choose to work. Some examples could include; four Saturday's in April, forty hours during March or four hours for fourteen

days. Make up your own commitment and connect with the work site closest to you.

Long-Term Recovery Committees are active in four affected areas: Wabash Valley Long-Term Disaster Recovery Coalition (Terre Haute area), Morgan County Long-Term Recovery Committee (Martinsville area), Bartholomew County Long-Term Recovery Committee (Columbus area) and Rebuild Owen County Committee (Spencer area). Mission & Social Justice member Shane O'Neill confirmed the current springtime needs with these four people. Each of the areas would welcome your call.

Olivet Update

February 25, 2009

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I would like to update the status of the civil action the Presbytery of Ohio Valley (POV) has undertaken to discern the proper ownership of property held in trust for the PC (USA). As many of you are aware every attempt at mediation with Olivet Presbyterian Church ended with impasse. Thus, the Presbytery appointed task force has asked the court to make a summary judgment based on information provided by both the POV and Olivet to avoid a protracted, public, and potentially divisive trial.

Through our counsel, the POV will be reporting to the court on March 11 regarding the stipulated record. Following this meeting, there will be a briefing schedule which may extend for 60 days or longer. It is our hope that this case will be fully briefed during this timeframe to allow the Judge to hand down a ruling sometime in June and once-and for-all determine the validity of the Trust clause for the PC(USA) in this Presbytery and in the state of Indiana.

If the court rules in favor of the POV, the task force will sit down with the good people of

conferences, sharing the excitement. With just one trip we can be fed by the variety of ministries of the church while engaging in our own particular passions and calls. 

40 Hour Fasts

Last summer the General Assembly invited all Presbyterians to join in the spiritual practice of monthly 40-hour fasts that include discernment and reflection, as a way of responding to the Global Food Crisis. The hope is that the practice will lead to meaningful and coordinated actions to accompany those who are poor and hungry around the world.

Each month the fast centers around a particular country and a specific cause that has contributed to the global food crisis. The fasts typically take place on the first weekend of every month, beginning on Friday evening and ending with Communion or a communal meal on Sunday.

Decatur, GA- The Lilly Endowment, Inc., has awarded Columbia Theological Seminary a five-year grant of \$648,863 to support continuation of the seminary's S3 Project, "Cultivation of Pastoral Excellence through Sabbath, Study, and Service." Now in its seventh year, S3 offers small, selfselected groups of pastors the opportunity to design and participate in group learning projects that strengthen their practice of ministry. Groups are selected annually by application and receive some financial support for their projects. Participating groups also attend two retreats on the Columbia campus: one for orientation and a follow-up during which groups report and reflect on individual project outcomes. 

Spotlight in the Resource Center





In this in-depth study of eight diverse mainline Protestant congregations, anthropologist Fredric Roberts finds that when local congregations are evaluated by spiritual and religious standards instead of corporate- or pop-culture-based values there remains much to celebrate. Roberts recommends that congregations work to discover their own uniqueness and to build upon the strength that already exist among its own members. Be Not Afraid! is a guide to help congregations rediscover their true calling to be nurturing faith communities, committed to spreading the good news and making disciples.

Pastor and author N. Graham Standish describes how a church that is open to God's purpose, presence, and power can claim God's blessing.

Standish shares the story of Calvin Presbyterian Church in Zelienople, Pennsylvania, and its journey to become a spiritually deep congregation, one that is inwardly and outwardly healthy: spiritually, psychologically, physically, and relationally.

Becoming a Blessed Church will help you discern God's purpose and the path God is calling your congregation to walk. This book will help you find Christ in your midst and become aware of the many ways the blessings of God's Spirit flow through your congregation.
