
Bloomington United - International Food Fair

In the Resource Center: The Price of Stones

The Price of Stones: Building A School for My Village is the fascinating account of one man's determination to bring help and hope the AIDS orphaned children of his village in western Uganda.

In 2001, Twesigye Kaguri and his wife began the process that would result in an accredited, tuition-free school for the orphans. This year, they graduated their second class of 26 with a passing rate of 98% on the National Primary Level Exam. 48 of their students are now in secondary school and one is in vocational college. This is a truly amazing story of how a dream for a better future can be made into reality.
