These folk will return to Korea itself or to other places of origin. The church has an administrative commission, but in reality self-governs through a program committee. This group is one of the five largest worshipping communities in the presbytery.

For the last 15 years the congregation has been served by Pastor Sang Tae Lee. Pastor Lee is a second career minister who previously worked in higher education. He is a wonderful leader for this group and has served well. Denominational identity is not the binding reality, but rather the skill, knowledge and passion of the pastor. The success of the Bloomington group and even its identity is tied deeply to the pastor. Please pray for Pastor Lee and his flock. Week of February 21 Hemenway Memorial, Boonville Rev. Tamara Recob

This last year for Hemenway Memorial Presbyterian Church has been one of healing and revitalization.
