Petersburg, Main Street

Main Street Presbyterian Church is located at 910 Main Street in Petersburg, Indiana and was founded in 1821 as part of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. The present building was first dedicated in 1886. In September 1905 the Old School Presbyterian and the Cumberland Presbyterian churches of Petersburg voted to unite. The actual union took place in November of 1906, and the present building became the home of the united churches, named Main Street Presbyterian Church. Our current transitional minister is Rev. Bill Owens.

We are a small congregation striving to make a big difference in our community. Helping others has always been a priority for us. We have a strong scholarship program that provides financial aid for members, their children and their grandchildren. We have sponsored concerts, both in house and at other venues, for both Christian groups and classical performers.

Our mission is to be an example of Christ's love for others and a resource for our community's needs - spiritually, physically, and financially. We currently both sponsor and participate in many community help programs including our local food and clothing bank, community festivals, school enhancement programs and mission trips.

Averaging over 40 in worship, the church maintains a Sunday school, youth ministries, and an annual Vacation Bible school, as well as hosting many social events. The original church structure burned due to an electrical fire in 2004, but a new worship space and community center was built and is debt-free. The church family is known for its welcoming atmosphere, vital spirituality, and strong personal connections. The Fairview Church has been served part-time by retired clergy for the past 30+ years, and its present pastor is the Rev. Mark Holland who resides in Evansville.

Sunday, May 23 Princeton, Princeton

The newly-established Princeton Presbyterian Church is located in the heart of Princeton, near the Square. The church will celebrate its 3rd anniversary next year, as it was formed in January of 2019 as a result of a merger between the former United Presbyterian Church and the former First Presbyterian Church. Currently, Sunday worship services are being held at 10:30 AM on an alternating basis at each building located on State Street and Hart Street respectively. We discontinued some of the activities we hosted due to the Pandemic; however, we plan to continue them as soon as possible. Some of these activities include an Adult and Children Sunday School every Sunday at 9:00 A.M., a Contemporary Worship Service every third Sunday, a Free Community Meal every third Saturday, and a Movie Night when there is a Fifth Sunday in the month. We earnestly seek your prayer support for our church, so we may continue to be an outreach in our community and be witnesses of the Gospel to all age groups.

Sunday, May 30 Center for Congregations Rev. Wendy McCormick

The Center for Congregations is fully funded by the Lilly Endowment as a gift to Indiana congregations. Its mission is to strengthen local congregations. The Center offers no-cost consulting, education events (currently all online and all free), and grants. POV minister at large, Wendy McCormick, Director of Satellite Synergy, works in the Evansville office, serving congregations in southwest Indiana, as well as coordinating the Center's statewide efforts. The Center staff appreciates prayers as it seeks to be more responsive to the needs of rural congregations, immigrant congregations, and congregations of color.
